We are willing to do what it takes

Thirty three families with **74** children participated in the St. Lawrence Place Program. **58%** of those families went on to permanent housing.

Twenty seven children were enrolled in our after school program, offered to our residents as well as the residents of the nearby Family Shelter. An additional **12** community children attended full-day Summer or Spring Break Camps at St. Lawrence Place. Free child care was provided to all St. Lawrence Place children during life skill meetings and other resident events.



Hundreds of volunteers from local churches, schools, universities, civic organizations, and businesses spent over **1600** hours at SLP, mentoring children, renovating apartments, or leading special activities for our families.
